

MICROCHIP INFORMATION



Congratulations on adopting your new dog! We appreciate you choosing Animal Farm Foundation! Along with the joy of owning a pet comes responsibility, including registering your pet's microchip.

WHAT IS A MICROCHIP?

A microchip is a small chip that is inserted under a dog's skin, generally in between their shoulder blades, for electronic identification purposes. Should your dog become lost, when found, an animal control officer, vet or shelter worker may scan for a microchip with a microchip scanner. The scanner will detect the dog's unique microchip number. When registered, each number is associated with the owner's contact information.



HOW DO I REGISTER?

Good news, your dogs microchip is already registered! We did all the heavy lifting and registered your dogs microchip with the Found Animals Registry for you. Leaving you with more time to get to know your newest addition. If someone scans your dog's microchip the information you provided us at the time of adoption will come up.

WHAT IF I MOVE OR CHANGE MY NUMBER?

Just head over to www.foundanimals.org/microchip-registry and use your dog's microchip number to update your information. Found Animals does not charge any fees to update your info. Yup, it's that simple! **Remember to keep your microchip number in a safe place for future reference.**



WHAT IF MY DOG'S CHIP IS MADE BY A DIFFERENT COMPANY?

While most of our dogs have Found Animal microchips, depending on where the dog originated he/she may have a different microchip company listed on their paperwork. No need to worry, Found Animals registers any microchip. No matter the microchip company, we register all our microchip through Found Animals because they are fee free.
